Aberfeldy

Constructed by the Dewar brothers in 1896. It is located on the eastern outskirts of Aberfeldy, on the southern bank of the upper Tay (161 km away). Chaps over there marry malt and grain whisky separately before blending, followed by the final phase of marrying. Aberfeldy's character is malty with dried fruits, toffee, and nutmeg.

AnCnoc

AnCnoc (usually written "anCnoc") whisky, produced at the Knockdhu Distillery, is known for its light, yet complex flavour profile. The distillery is located in Knock (76km away) and was established in 1894 by John Morrison. AnCnoc means "the hill" in Gaelic.

Ardmore

Founded by Adam Teacher, son of blender William Teacher in 1898. Based in Kennethmont (52km away) the picturesque location was ideal with access to water, growing barley and proximity to the railway between Inverness and Aberdeen. Ardmore mostly uses barrier-only filtration as it preserves more of the malt's flavour compared to chill filtration. The spirit produced is rich and moderately peaty, with heather, earthy smoke, vanilla and honey.

Ardnamurchan distillery was founded by their parent company and owner Adelphi independent bottle company in 2014. Located in Glenbeg on the Ardnamurchan peninsula (331 km away). Ardnamurchan's style is gentle peat smoke, rich oily honey, dark fruit, chilli and sea salt - rugged west coast air makes their whisky unreplicable elsewhere.

Balblair

Located in Edderton (218km away) and founded in 1790, the distillery was rebuilt in 1895 by the designer Charles C Doig to be closer to the railway station. Balblair Distillery's character is described as fruity, sweet, and sometimes spicy, with notes of grass and hay - the product of the patience and dedication of craftspeople, who won't settle for anything than the best.

Founded by John MacDonald in 1825, the distillery is nestled at the foot of Britain's highest mountain Ben Nevis (245km away). Ben Nevis whisky is known for its strong, intense character, with a complex flavor profile that includes notes of honey, heather, spice and a touch of smoke.

Brora

Brora distillery was built in 1819 by the Marquess of Stafford in Brora (257km away), although it was known as "Clynelish" until the opening of the Clynelish Distillery, whereupon the name of the original Clynelish was changed to "Brora". It was mothballed from 1983 until 2021 when it was reactivated. The waxy, oily, marine and mineral character seen in Clynelish is exaggerated in Brora's whisky with added lemon acidity.

Established in 1967 and built next to the now called Brora distillery (257km away) to satisfy the need for blends. Clynelish's character is distinctive waxy mouthfeel, orange oiliness and minerality.

Dalmore

Founded in 1839 in Alness (200km away) by entrepreneur Alexander Matheson and sold to Andrew and Charles Mackenzie in 1867, who introduced the 12-pointed Royal Stag emblem. The Dalmore brand is known for its luxurious and meticulously crafted whisky that stand out for their richness, refinement and complex flavour profile.

Deanston

Built in Deanston (188km away) in 1785 as a cotton mill designed by Sir Richard Arkwright, it remained as such for 180 years until it was transformed into a distillery in 1966. Deanston generates all of its own power via a waterwheel. It's so powerful, that the distillery has enough leftover to sell roughly 75% of the power to the national grid. It produces a clean, honeyed, and fruity spirit with subtle nutty and malty undertones.

Edradour

Built in 1825 and located in Pitlochry (154km away). The distillery was traditionally run by three men; now there are two. Eighteen casks are produced each week. Renowned for experimenting with various outlandish wood finishes such as Chardonnay, Sauternes or Tokaji wood. Edradour's character is rich, sweet with nutmeg, clove, cinnamon and creamy finish.

Fettercairn

Fettercairn distillery was founded in 1824 in Fettercairn (54km away). Fettercairn's unicorn is said to stand for purity and strength and has been a symbol of Scotland since the reign of King Robert III. The distillery uses a distinctive cooling ring innovation to influence its distillation process, contributing to its light, tropical, and fruity flavor profile.

Glen Garioch

Glen Garioch is one of the oldest distilleries founded in 1797 in Oldmeldrum (30km away). The official distillery founding date is predated by an article in the Aberdeen Journal on the 1st December 1785, which announced the first distillation of spirit at the site. The whisky produced has sweet chocolate and butterscotch character with rich spices.

Located in Brechin (64km away) and established in 1825 by George Cooper. Glencadam's stills have a special feature: the gooseneck (lyne arm) does not go off at a right angle, but points upwards at an angle of 15 degrees - this makes milder and softer distillate. Glencadam single malts are heavy, spicy with fruity aromas and often flavours of cream and forest berries.

Founded in 1826 by James Allardes in Huntly (64km away). Glendronach's production is very manual and traditional - copper stills were still coal fired until 2005. Ever since the BenRiach acquisition the whisky has been matured exclusively in sherry and port. Glendronach's whisky is strong with sweet sherry aroma, very round with full body and a lot of Christmas cake notes.

The distillery's flavour profile is the harmony between lush tropical sweetness and coastal sea salt.

Founded in 1833 in Dumgoyne (224km away) by George Connell. Glengoyne is distilled particularly slowly to maximise reflux, and thus producing a lighter spirit. The distillery's character is unpeated, sweet and malty with a trace of fresh apples when younger; older bottles are thick and oily with dry fruit.

Glenmorangie

Glenmorangie distillery was established in 1843 in Tain (220km away). The distillery has the largest stills of any distillery in Scotland (5.14m high) that guarantees particularly light and mild spirit. Glenmorangie only uses its oak barrels twice and its house style is a very balanced whisky with fine nuances of citrus fruits and vanilla.

Glenturret

The oldest distillery in Scotland located in Hosh (172km away) - officially founded in 1763 but had previously been under the control of illicit distillers since 1717. The distillery began the transition away from peat in production, with peated expressions in the core range removed from 2026 onward focusing on making the fruity whiskies they want to be known for.

Loch Lomond was established in 1964 in Alexandria (235km away). Their stills include special distillation trays in the necks, allowing for greater contact with the cooling alcohol vapour - these stills can produce alcohol up to 90% ABV where normal is around 70% ABV. Loch Lomond style is orchard fruit, honey, and soft smoke.

Nc'nean

Founded in 2017 by Annabel Thomas in Drimnin on the Morvern peninsula (328km away). The distillery focuses on producing an organic spirit with minimum impact on the local environment achieving net zero carbon emissions during whisky production. Nc'nean whisky is sweet and fruity, with notes of peaches, nectarines, ripe apples, and green banana.

Oban

Built in Oban in 1794 (290km away) by the brothers John and Hugh Stevenson. Oban's worm tubs have a unique feature; they contain two worms nested within one another - it results in slightly less meaty than usual spirit. Oban skillfully combines the properties of the islands with the lighter, fruity single malts producing a catchy, mild, only slightly smoky and maritime whisky.

Founded in 1826 in Wick (328km away). Old Pulteney wash still has a uniquely shaped boiling ball which has inspired the iconic shape of the bottle you see today. Old Pulteney is known for its rich, fruity, and malty flavors, with characteristic notes of the sea breeze and brine.

Built and burnt down 3 times by illicit competition, supposedly. The current, 4th building, was built in 1845 by John Begg near Balmoral Castle (77km away). The distillery was awarded its first Royal Warrant in 1848 and it is the smallest distillery in Diageo's portfolio. The whisky is known for a balanced and elegant character with notes of honey, toffee and fruit.

Tomatin

Established in 1897 in Tomatin (157km away). Tomatin is one of the top 10 biggest distilleries in Scotland, but in 1987 it was referred to as the biggest. In recent years, a massive effort has been made to bolster its name resulting in expanding the core range and the emergence of Cù Bòcan, which is a lightly peaty, innovative in finish, often tropical and produced only in 1 week of December each year. Tomatin whisky is malty, fruity with a delicate aroma and a touch of spice.

Tullibardine

Founded in 1949 in Blackford (169km away). Tullibardine is one of a small number of distilleries in Scotland where all processes involved in the production of our single malt whisky take place on-site, including a one-man cooperage. The Tullibardine character is orchard fruits like apples and pears, often paired with citrus undertones and toffee smoothness.

Wolfburn

Original Wolfburn distillery was founded in 1821 in Thurso (341km away), but was shut in 1877. It was revived in 2013, 350m from the old one. Wolfburn fashion the whisky the same way it was always made: by hand, using only the finest ingredients, and without haste. The whiskies produced have a range of flavours, including chocolate, fruit, and peat smoke.

Aberlour distillery was built in Aberlour (93km away) by a local legend James Fleming in 1879. Since 1986, Aberlour has won 58 Gold awards and 8 Trophies from the International Wine and Spirits Competition (IWSC) and International Spirits Challenge (ISC). The distillery's style is usually all sweet with sherry; fruity and comforting.

Balvenie

Founded in 1892 in Dufftown (85km away). David Stewart MBE, Balvenie's Malt Master, was the first to create the process that is today known as wood finishing which changed the industry forever. One of the few distilleries in Scotland that goes from barley to cask on site, with much of the barley being grown on site, malted on site, distilled and filled in casks that are coopered on site. Balvenie's character is smooth sweet honey, vanilla, exotic fruits and banana fudge.

Established in 1898 by John Duff just south of Elgin (106km away). Benriach is one of the most diverse in terms of its single malt portfolio, if not the most. Some of them are very light, smooth and fruity but there also are heavily peaty, oily and smoky whiskies in the range. Benriach has a remarkable portfolio of extravagant single malts with a wide variety of flavor profiles.

Founded in 1826 by Peter McKenzie in Aberlour (95km away). The distillery was destroyed in 1829, rebuilt in 1835 under the name Lyne of Ruthrie and renamed shortly after it changed hands. Benrinnes is one of the few distilleries in the Speyside, who distil their malt three times. The whisky produced is intense and creamy with notes such as toffee, vanilla and smoke.

Built in 1898 by Duncan McCallum and F.W. Brickman near Forres (126km away). Benromach was saved from their downfall by the renowned independent bottler Gordon & MacPhail in 1993 and is now one of the most exciting whisky producers in the region. The distillery's style is floral, malty, often creamy, sometimes tender smoky, and always energetic.

Established in 1824 by Helen Cumming and her husband John near Upper Knockando (103km away). The word "Cardhu" derives from the Scottish Gaelic Carn Dubh, meaning "Black Rock". The whisky produced is one of the lightest on the market, wonderfully harmonious and balanced with pleasant spice and aromas of blossom honey, caramel and orange.

Cragganmore

Founded in 1869 by John Smith near Ballindalloch (108km away). Instead of the normal, conical neck of a pot still, Cragganmore's pot stills have a flat top and a relatively short neck which is an essential contributor to the taste of the final product. The whisky produced is rich and meaty with a mix of citrus, spice and fruit as it matures.

Built in 1891 in Craigellachie (90km away) by Craigellachie Distillery Co. Limited, a group of blenders and merchants led by Alexander Edward. Staying true to traditions and production methods; they still use worm-tubs to cool the spirit. Craigellachie means "rocky hill" and its style is sweet, malty, nutty, as well as fruity and muscular.

Established in 1898 by William Simpson and James Carle in Fogwatt (106km away). The key to Glen Elgin's floral and fruity orchard style lays in very clear wort during fermentation which lays the foundation for it. The next crucial step is a slow distillation where the undesired sulfur compounds are eliminated to further elevate the distillery's elegant character.

Built in 1840 by brothers John and James Grant, two former illegal distillers and smugglers who decided to take out a licence in Rothes (96km away). Barely 20 years after the Grant whisky distillery opened, it became the first Scottish distillery to feature electric light. Glen Grant is known for its "classic Speyside style" - refreshing green orchard fruit, delicate and smooth.

Founded in 1832 by Stewart & Galbraith Co. and located in the north of Campbeltown, on the Kintyre Peninsula (398km away). Glen Scotia uses three types of malt (unpeated, medium-peated and heavily-peated) are sourced from Greencore Maltings, southwest of Scotland. The flavour profile is fresh with toffee, maritime salt and oily body. In 2021, Glen Scotia was awarded Best Scottish Whisky Distillery and won Best Whisky in the World for its 25 year old - the first year any distillery has ever won best distillery and best whisky in the same year.

The whisky produced is usually lightly peaty and salty with earthy notes.

Springbank

Established in 1828 by the Reid Brothers in Campbeltown, on the Kintyre Peninsula (398km away). J&A Mitchell also own Glengyle distillery, William Cadenheads (the oldest independent bottler) and a few blends. Springbank releases 3 different variants: Hazelburn (unpeated and triple distilled), Springbank (lightly peaty - 6hrs of peat smoke, 2.5 times distilled) and Longrow (heavily peaty - 48hrs of peat smoke, twice distilled).

Founded in 1836 by George Donald in Annan (349km away), but closed down in 1924. Bought over in 2007 and following a four year and £10.5m restoration project, production finally resumed in 2014, after a mere 90 year hiatus. Annandale has two core expressions: Man O' Sword (peated, honoring Robert the Bruce) and Man O' Words (unpeated, honoring Robert 'Rabbie' Burns). The distillery operates similarly to an independent bottler as they release cask strength single casks exclusively.
